



Who May Apply?

AIM HIGH Flight Academy Student Application and Nomination Information Sheet



Student Eligibility Criteria:

- High school students aged 16-18; or ROTC/USAFA cadets
- Students must be at least 16 years old by June 1st in the year of the desired AIM HIGH Flight Academy
- Students must have an unweighted cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of 3.0 or above on a 4.0 scale
- Students must **not** hold a private pilot's certificate or license

Additional Application Requirements:

- **The application deadline is 30 November 2022**
- The student's High School must provide an **official transcript**
- Parent/Legal Guardian signed approval is required for all minors and high school students
- COVID-19 health safety procedures must be followed in accordance with university policies
- AFROTC/USAFA Cadets should apply through HQ AFROTC or through the AFA summer scheduling

How to Start an Application:

Students initiate their AHFA scholarship application online at <https://www.recruiting.af.mil/Aim-High-Flight-Academy/> by clicking the link under the How to Apply tab. The student will provide contact information for the nominator and school official, and they will receive emails with links to complete their nomination and transcript submission. If the nominator is affiliated with any of our strategic partners, please indicate that on the nominator contact information. Application and documents must be submitted within the application window time. Late applications will not be accepted.

Application Steps:

1. Student responds to profile and application questions online. If the student has any questions while applying, they may send questions to AFRS Det 1 via Afrs.ahfa.studentapplications@us.af.mil
2. Student provides their high school official's contact information
 - The high school official will be prompted via email to upload an official transcript
3. Student submits a Nominator/Recommender name and contact information
 - The nominating or recommending person will be prompted via email to accomplish the Student Nomination Assessment
4. Student accomplishes the Activity Sheet Responses
5. Student accomplishes the Creative Essay
6. Student submits Creative Graphic by uploading it as a pdf, jpg, png, tiff, or word text file
7. Submit Parent/Legal Guardian approval
 - Students are responsible to obtain and upload verifiable Parent/Legal Guardian signed document. Please upload as a pdf, jpg, png, tiff, or word text file
8. Students must read, acknowledge, and accept program certification guidelines
9. Students are responsible for ensuring all the required application responses are complete, nominating official is accurate, and all documents (transcript, Activity Sheet, Essay and Graphic, as well as Parent/Legal Guardian approval) are submitted successfully
