- Meet Air Force moral and physical requirements
- Be able to obtain the appropriate security clearance level
- Complete Officer Training School (eight-week training program at Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama)

OUALITY OF LIFE


Being a member of our Air Force family means taking care of your family as well. The Air Force is committed to providing you with a quality of life that allows you to devote more time to your family.

CAREER GROWTH


